



GRATUITIES GUIDELINES

While tipping is not mandatory in Africa, it is a well-established custom to show appreciation for good service at the end of your safari. Gratuities are entirely at your discretion and should reflect the level of service you feel you received.

Tipping is *solely at your discretion* and should be based on your experience and the quality of service you have received.

We're frequently asked about appropriate tipping practices, so we've outlined the following general guidelines. These are simply suggestions, intended to help you, not to impose expectations.

- **TRACKERS:** **\$400 - \$700 PER SAFARI**
- **CAMP STAFF:** **\$300 - \$600 PER SAFARI**
- **SKINNERS:** **\$350 - \$500 PER SAFARI**
- **CHEF:** **\$800 - \$1500 PER SAFARI**
- **PH:** **\$800-\$2000 PER SAFARI**

Although tips can be added to your final invoice at the end of the safari, the preferred method is direct cash to each recipient.

Small, thoughtful gifts are also very welcome and often cherished. If you'd like to bring something along, consider items that are lightweight and easy to pack—such as books, pens, folding knives, cookbooks, or caps and T-shirts that reflect your home region, profession, or favorite sports team.

Your generosity, whether through tips or tokens of appreciation, goes a long way and is always deeply valued by the team.
